
The Institute's Inaugural Cohort




Racial Equity Dashboard INVESTMENT PORTFOLIO

Racial Equity Dashboard GRANTMAKING

- In 2022, 58% of all Deaconess
 Foundation grants were made to organizations led by people from the world's global majority
- According to a study by New Profit in 2020, organizations led by Black, Indigenous, and Latino/a/x leaders receive only an estimated 4% of total grants and contributions



Racial Equity Dashboard EQUITABLE CULTURE GOALS: 2023 – 2024

GOAL

Codify existing practices of current leadership to endure beyond any one administration.

Establish methods for radical listening and intentional collaboration (sharing power) that reject power-hoarding behavior, paternalism, defensiveness, individualism, and the internalized idea that "I'm the only one who can do something."

Racial Equity Dashboard EQUITABLE CULTURE GOALS: 2024 – 2025

GOAL

Build metrics associated with priorities and habits to codify existing practices of current leadership, maintaining and building a culture of ongoing learning into job descriptions; alter subsequent performance evaluation systems that determine raises and promotions to materially reward desired behaviors by December 31, 2024.

Conduct a policy and processes review to locate areas for improvement and formalize processes for addressing racial bias and inequities.

Build an all-staff-led onboarding process for new staff and a cadence of staff and board retreats that center racial equity in learning and development opportunities for the whole team.

Racial Equity Dashboard EQUITABLE CULTURE GOALS: 2025 – 2026

GOAL

Establish clear and consistent communication that explicitly messages Deaconess' commitment to racial equity. Ensure this is made available to staff and board and external partners by January 31, 2025.

Establish internal processes and systems that are accessible and accountable to people of the global majority by December 31, 2025.


Amplify anonymous feedback loops for staff to name racial tensions or dynamics of white supremacy culture with the help of external mediators by January 31, 2025.




IN-PERSON FOCUS GROUPS


